GENERAL TECHNICAL RULES

1. TIME AND DURATION

The 54^{th} International Children's Games will take place from $11^{th}-16^{th}$ August 2022 in Coventry, United Kingdom.

2. PROGRAMME

The programme of the 54th International Children's Games includes the following disciplines:

SUMMER SPORTS

- **TEAM SPORTS**: Basketball 3v3, Football (6 A-Side)
- INDIVIDUAL SPORTS: Athletics, Climbing, Swimming, Table Tennis, Tennis

For team sports, and combat sports each team or individual must have 2 different colours of sport uniform.

3. PARTICIPANTS

Delegates: up to 23

- Participating athletes must reside or attend school in the city in which they represent.
- Athletes must be 12 years old by January 1 the year of the Games and must still be 15 years old, on December 31 the year of the Games.

4. EVENT ACCREDITATION, CONTROL AND SANCTIONS

- All participants of the Games (athletes, coaches, other participants) need to have accreditation provided by the organiser of the Games. The Event Accreditation Pass will include the Participant's photo, sport entry their First and Last name, City and Country.
- The Head of Delegation is obliged to give the accurate data during the entry process. The Head of Delegation may need to make access available to all information including legal documentation on their team, in case of any complaint or issues. It is therefore advisable to bring copies of all documentation to the Games.
- In the case of fraud, the city will be obliged to pay all penalty expenses and fines imposed by the Executive Committee of ICG.
- The Referee of the appointed sport as well as the Head of Competition must inspect the athlete's Accreditation Passes before commencing the competition.
- All athletes must show their accreditation with a photo; without this card an athlete cannot compete.



5. TECHNICAL MEETINGS

- Some 4-6 weeks prior to the Games, the Technical Board will visit the facilities and have Technical Meetings with Tournament Directors and Head Referees of all sports.
- On the morning of Practice Day, a joint Technical Meeting will be held with Technical Commission members, Tournament Directors, Heads of Delegation, and all coaches, followed with individual Technical Meetings between each TC Member, their Tournament Director and coaches for that sport.

6. AUTHORITY AND JURISDICTION

- A Head of Delegation may file a sport protest. To do so they will follow the Sport Protest procedure for the International Children's Games.
- All sport protests will be heard and either denied or investigated by the ICG Protest Committee. The Protest Committee members are:

Representative of the host city	
Vice president of ICG	
Member of ICG TC	
Head of referee of the sport	
Referee of the sport (Invited members)	

- All decisions by the Protest Committee are final and binding.
- Sports Protests must be initiated, in writing, by the City's Head of Delegation, as soon as possible after the incident, which is the subject of the protest. The protest must provide the details necessary for the Committee's review and should be submitted to the Head Referee for that sport or any one of the Protest Committee members.
- All protests require a 100 GBP protest fee to be paid to the ICG before a protest will be heard. Only one protest by a city's Head of Delegation can be filed per sport incident.
- If the Head of Delegation refuses, or is unable to submit a protest in writing, the Protest Committee may exercise its discretion and investigate the protest.
- Subject to any limits imposed either by law or by this procedure, information (whether oral
 or written) which is created, gathered, received, or compiled through the course of an
 investigation will be treated as confidential by all involved in the investigation and
 adjudication of the protest.



7. DISCIPLINARY RULES

- The ICG Code of Conduct must be always adhered to. Athletes and coaches will be excluded from the Games for indecent behavior, offence made through words and/or actions, violent behavior, and abusive language.
- All delegations must comply with any instruction given by the venue staff.
- Coaches are responsible for the safety, well-being, and behavior of their athletes at all times.

8. PRESENTATION OF MEDALS

The following Medals will be awarded:

Gold: For individuals and teams ranking first place in the competition.

Silver: For individuals and teams ranking second place in the competition.

Bronze: For individuals and teams ranking third place in the competition.

- Medals will only be awarded to the first three athletes/teams in the A Finals.
- Medal presentations will be made at designated times as per schedule. Athletes must wear their competition uniform or team tracksuit for the ceremony. Team coaches are requested to assist in ensuring athletes are readily available and correctly dressed.

9. MEDICAL

- First aid will be available on site. At this first aid station, a doctor, a nurse, a physiotherapist, and an ambulance will be present and available for all participants.
- Serious cases will be referred to University Hospital Coventry & Warwickshire.

10. ATHLETES WITH A DISABILITY

- The Coventry Games are planning to include sports for young athletes with a disability to attend the
 Games. The targeted sports at present are 3X3 Wheelchair Basketball, Swimming and Track and Field.
 (Other sports may be considered). If your city is interested in bringing athletes with a disability as
 part of your delegation to the Games please contact the LOC directly on coventryicg2022@mlsgb.co
- A number of Cities will be allowed to bring additional disabled athletes and their coaches to
 participate in the Coventry Games on top of the maximum delegation size (23 people) as outlined in
 this document.

11.SPECIAL NOTE

No changes can be made to any part of the ICG THs without the consent of the Technical Commission.



BASKETBALL 3 on 3

Date of competition: 13 – 15th August 2022

2. VENUE

3. COURT

- The game will be played on a court (size 12m X 12m) playing with one (1) basket.
- The court shall have a regular basketball playing court sized zone, including a free throw line (5.80m), a three point line (6.75m) and a no-charge semi-circle area underneath the one basket.

4. COMPETITION INFORMATION

4.1 Teams

- Number of teams that can participate: Maximum 16 Boys and 16 Girls Teams
- Each team shall consist of a maximum of four (4) players (3 players on the court and 1 substitute) and one (1) coach.
- Number of coaches: One (1) for Boys' team & One (1) for Girls' team.



4.2 Points

- Basket made from within the 2-point area (inside the 3-point line arc) = 1 point.
- Free throw = 1 point.
- Basket made from the 3-point shot area (beyond the 3-point line arc) = 2 points.

4.3 Game Officials

• The game officials shall be one (1) referee assisted by three (3) table officials, namely a scorer, a timer and a twelve (12) second operator.

4.4 Basketball Apparel

- Basketball Teams must have a minimum of two sets of shirts as well as basketball shoes, socks, shorts, t-shirt. All equipment used by players must be appropriate for the game.
- Any equipment that is designed to increase a players' height or reach or in any other way give an unfair advantage is not permitted.

4.5 Ball size

• 7 for boys and 6 for girls or official FIBA 3 on 3 ball

4.6 Beginning of the Game

- Both teams shall warm-up (3 minutes) simultaneously.
- Before the game, a player from team A will take a 3-point shot. If made team A shall begin
- The game with a throw-in, if not, it will be team B. The team that did not start the game.

4.7 Playing time/Winner of a Game

- The regular playing time shall be 12 min (10 min does not include stopping time + 2 last min include stopping time).
- The clock shall be stopped during dead ball situations and free throws. The clock shall be restarted after the exchange of the ball is completed (as soon as it is in the offensive team's hands).
- However, the first team which scores 21 or more points wins the game if it happens before the end of a regular playing time. This rule applies to regular playing time only (not in a potential overtime).
- If the score is tied at the end of playing time, an extra period will be played. There shall be an Interval of one (1) minute before the overtime starts. The first team to score two (2) points in the overtime wins the game.

4.8 Fouls by Player/Fouls by Team

- A team is in a team foul situation when it has committed seven (7) fouls.
- A player who has committed four (4) fouls must leave the game.
- Fouls during the act of shooting inside the arc shall be awarded with one (1) free throw.
- Fouls during the act of shooting behind the arc shall be awarded with two (2) free throws.
- Fouls during the act of shooting followed by a successful field goal shall be awarded one (1) additional free-throw.
- Non-shooting fouls under penalty foul situation shall be awarded with one (1) free throw.
- In case of a technical foul, the penalty will be one (1) shot and possession.
- In case of an unsportsmanlike foul, the penalty will be two (2) shots and possession.



4.9 Twelve second device

- The team must attempt a shot for a field goal within 12 seconds.
- The 12 second clock will be reset only when there is a foul or foot violation.

4.10 Stalling

- Stalling or failing to play actively by attempting to score shall be a violation.
- A team must attempt a shot within twelve (12) seconds. The game starts only after basket was scored over the 3 point's line and not underneath the basket.
- If the court is not equipped with a shot clock and a team is not sufficiently trying to attack the basket, the referee shall give them a warning by counting the last 5 seconds.

4.11 How the Ball is played

- Following each successful field goal or last free throw:
 - A player from a non-scoring team will resume the game by passing the ball from the place directly from the court underneath the basket (not from behind the end line) to his teammate to any place on the court. However, if that place is not behind the three-point line, the ball receiver must dribble/pass the ball to a place on the court behind the three-point line.
- Following each unsuccessful field goal or last free throw:
 If the offensive team rebound the ball, it may continue to attempt the score without returning the ball to behind the three-point line.
- If the defensive team rebound the ball, it must return the ball (by passing or dribbling) behind the three-point line.
- Once the ball is behind the three-point line at least one additional pass must be made to a teammate before an attempt to score is made.
- Following the steal, turnover etc.:
 - If it happens within the two-point area, the ball must be passed/dribbled to a place behind the three-point line. Once the ball is behind the three-point line, at least one additional pass must be made to a teammate before the attempt to score is made.
- Should the first offensive player who has dribbled/received the ball at a place behind the three-point line attempt to score, it is a violation.
- All throw-ins following the fouls (without free throws), violations, out of bounds, at the beginning
 of the first period and of the extra period shall be taken from the out-of-bounds place level with
 the top of the three-point line, closest to the infraction. The places shall be marked in out-ofbounds by 5 cm line. The referee shall hand the ball to the out-of-bound player. The thrower-in
 must pass the ball to his teammate to any place on the court. However, if that place is not behind
 the three-point, the ball receiver must dribble/pass the ball to a place on the court behind the
 three-point line
- Dunking of the ball is not permitted unless pressure-released rings are used.

4.12 Substitutions

• The substitution shall be permitted when the ball becomes dead, and the game clock is stopped.

4.13 Time-outs

• There are no time-outs granted to any team at any time.



5. ESSENTIAL INFORMATION

- All the teams must be at the court 45 minutes before the designated fixture.
- Teams (Coaches, Players) should arrive at basketball venue with the necessary accreditation. All
 delegation must comply with any indication made by the venue staff, without creating any kind of issue
 to other teams. For any issue or protest, the Head of Delegation has to contact the competition
 manager immediately. If anything negative is observed, we request immediate report to the
 department responsible person.

6. DISCIPLINARY RULES

- The ICG Code of Conduct must be always adhered to. Athletes and coaches will be excluded from the Games for indecent behaviour, offence made through words and/or actions, violent behaviour, and abusive language.
- All delegations must comply with any instruction given by the venue staff.
- Coaches are responsible for the well-being and behaviour of their athletes at all times.



3. COMPETITION INFORMATION

Competitions are individual and will be held in the following disciplines: -

- Lead climbing and bouldering
- Speed climbing.

Number of participants in one team:

- Minimum: 1 boy and 1 girl and 1 coach.
- Maximum: 2 boys and 2 girls and 1 coach.



4. COMPETITION RULES

4.1 Competitions are held according to the rules of the International Federation of Sport Climbing (IFSC).

4.2 Lead Climbing

- Routes shall be climbed with the competitor belayed from below, securing themselves by clipping the rope to protection points. Progression along the line of the route determines a competitor's ranking.
- Lead competitions shall take place on purpose-designed, artificial climbing walls having a minimum height of 12 meters.
- Lead competitions shall normally consist of:
 - o A Qualification round of two (2) non-identical routes
 - o A Final round on a single route
- In the case of unforeseen events, it will be decided to cancel one of the rounds in which case the results of the previous round shall count as the ranking of the cancelled round.

4.3 Speed Climbing

Speed competitions shall take place on climbing routes with a nominal length of 15m, constructed on purpose-designed, artificial climbing walls (Record Format Wall with additional foot holds, the scheme is attached). Classic or automatic belaying may be used.

Speed competitions shall normally consist of:

- A Qualification round, consisting of a single stage; and
- A Final round, consisting of between two and four stages (1/8 final, 1/4 final, 1/2 final, and Final composed of Small Final and Big Final).

In the case of unforeseen events, it will be decided to cancel one of the rounds, in which case the results of the previous round shall count as the ranking of the cancelled round.

4.4 Bouldering

Bouldering competitors will compete on routes with a maximum height of 5 meters, and on an artificial surface with several specifically designed routes and problems.

Competition format will be across specifically designed problems with there being 3 rounds qualification, Semi-final, and finals @ 6 routes per round.

Scoring and timing will be judged and measured by climbing team officials.

5. DISCIPLINARY RULES

- The ICG Code of Conduct must be always adhered to. Athletes and coaches will be excluded from the Games for indecent behaviour, offence made through words and/or actions, violent behaviour, and abusive language.
- All delegations must comply with any instruction given by the venue staff.
- Coaches are responsible for the well-being and behaviour of their athletes at all times.





3. COMPETITION INFORMATION

- There will be separate tournaments for girls and boy's teams.
- One coach per team is allowed.
- Teams will consist of 6-8 players 1 of which will be a goalkeeper.
- Both the boy's team and the girl's team have a separate coach.
- Shin guards are required for all competitors.
- The venue is outdoor. Players must wear approved soccer cleats/shoes/boots. (Baseball type cleats are not allowed).
- Athletes are prohibited to wear any footwear with metal studs nor glasses/sunglasses during a game unless sports/plastic/protective glasses.

4. COMPETITION RULES

- The rules of the tournament will be FIFA rules modified for small-sided games.
- Depending on the number of entries, teams will be entered into pools of up to 4 teams.
- The pitch size will be 50-65 m by 40-45 m
- No offside rule will be operated
- The ball used will be a size 5.
- Each game will consist of 2 halves of 20 minutes each. Half-time break is 5 minutes.
- Warm up duration: 10 minutes.
- Team size consists of 6 players: (5 players that includes 1 Captain) and 1 goalkeeper
- Goal length 4,8-6 m and height 1,9-2 m.
- Competitions within group are led by 1 referee. Quarterfinals, semi-finals, and final game will be led by 2 referees.
- A system of rolling substitutions will apply.
- A timekeeper is required, controlling the duration of the games, using a horn/hooter as no injury time is allowed, except in the Final, which is at the discretion of the referee(s).
- The area between pitches should be kept clear for teams and officials only, with spectators viewing only from the opposite side.



- Throw-ins are allowed.
- Slide tackles are not allowed (punishable with a yellow card), but sliding to score, or to stop the ball going out of play or to stop a goal, is allowed.
- Goalkeepers can kick from the hand only after catching the ball.
- The Head Referee cannot become involved with refereeing decisions made on the field of play.
- The normal football back-pass rule applies.
- Goals cannot be scored directly from a kick-off.
- If a team does not show up for their first game they will be disqualified from the tournament but allowed to play the scheduled fixtures as "friendlies" at the discretion of the Tournament Director and the opposing teams.
- All team members wear the same football strip.

5. PRELIMINARY ROUNDS

- Each team will play all other teams in their pool once. Depending on the pool size and structure, the top teams will go forward to the Medal Rounds while the remaining teams will play placing games.
- In pool games, 3 points will be awarded for a win and 1 point for a draw.
- The top 2 teams in each group will advance to the quarter finals.
- In the case that teams in the same pool have the same number of points, the final standings will be decided by the following order:
 - 1. Head-to-head between the teams concerned.
 - 2. Goal difference resulting from the group matches ONLY between the teams concerned.
 - 3. Greater number of goals scored in all group matches ONLY between the teams concerned.
 - 4. Lower number of goals against in all group matches ONLY between the teams concerned.
 - 5. If still undecided, the winner will be decided by a coin flip by the Head Referee.

6. MEDAL ROUND

- The quarterfinals will be between the top teams in the Pool Round. The winners of one pool will play against the runner up in another pool.
- The Semi-finals will be between the 4 quarter-finals winners
- The final will be between the 2 semi-final winners.
- In the event of a draw at quarter-final, semi-final or final games it goes straight to penalties, any 5 from
 the full squad can take the first 5 penalties before moving to the rest of the squad if required. Squads
 for penalties shall be determined by the team with the lower number of players. The goalkeeper who
 finished the game must be in goal for at least the first penalty.



7. DISCIPLINARY RULES

- The ICG Code of Conduct must be always adhered to. Athletes and coaches will be excluded from the Games for indecent behaviour, offence made through words and/or actions, violent behaviour, and abusive language.
- All delegations must comply with any instruction given by the venue staff.
- Coaches are responsible for the well-being and behaviour of their athletes at all times.
- Player who receives a yellow card will be sent to the bench for two minutes. The 2 minutes start after play resumes.

Typical yellow card offences include:

Unsporting behavior, dissent by words or actions

• Players sent off (red card) for any reason will be suspended for the team's next game. <u>Typical red card offences include:</u>

Serious foul-play, violent conduct, abusive language.

• If a team is **permanently** reduced to 4 players due to sending offs, the game will end and the match will be awarded 2-0 to their opponents, unless the score, as it stands at that point, is more advantageous to their opponents.



3. COMPETITION INFORMATION

- Swimmers may compete in 4 events plus 2 relays.
- There will be the following competitions:

50m, 100m, 200m, 400m Freestyle

50m, 100m, 200m Backstroke

50m, 100m, 200m Breaststroke

50m, 100m, 200m Butterfly

200m Individual Medley

4 x100m Freestyle Relay

4 x100m Medley Relay

• Each City may enter a maximum of 4 boys and 4 girls and minimum 2 boys and 2 girls. (2+0, 2+0, minimum two athletes and one coach)



- Cities can enter a maximum of 2 swimmers per event.
- Swimmers must supply personal best performance times for each event during registration process.
- The pool is an indoor 50m 8-lane facility.
- Electronic timing and lane display scoreboard will be in use.
- Participant seating will be in the grandstand.
- One coach per city allowed.
- Swimmers may compete in 4 single events plus 2 relays.

4. COMPETITION RULES

- The meet will take place according to FINA and ICG rules.
- Racing suits are required for all competitors. Swimwear must comply with current FINA regulation.
- No dives or jumps are allowed unless in designated lanes opened by the officials or meet director.
- Athletes will be provided with full pool access for warm up at least 30 minutes prior to the first race commencing.
- A and B Finals will take place in all 50m and 100m events. Medals will only be awarded to the first three athletes/teams in 'A' Finals.
- Coaches must send personal best times for appropriate allotment of lanes.



3. COMPETITION INFORMATION

- Each team may enter a maximum number of 2 girls and 2 boys.
- Draws shall be conducted by the Sport Chair and the Referee and published and disseminated with the assistance of the competition management personnel.
- The Competition Management personnel shall occupy at least three tables along one side of the gym at floor level. They shall check players in, process and announce matches, produce, and disseminate updated results, maintain match card, and ball inventory control, answer inquiries, guard prizes and assist in their awarding, and produce results and statistics.
- One coach per city allowed.
- Tables: 16 tournament-quality tables and nets
- Balls: TBC in advance of the event.



- Surrounds: Enough top-quality surrounds to meet the RIC court dimension
- Gluing: Players needing to glue or re-glue their bats shall do so only in the outdoor area designated for the purpose.

4. COMPETITION RULES

- Rules in Effect: International Table Tennis Federation (ITTF) Regulations for International Competitions (RIC)
- A total of 64 players are expected (32 boys, 32 girls); they shall be divided into eight groups.
- All the players must be in the venue 50 minutes before the designated fixture.
- All matches shall be best 3 out of 5 games; games shall be scored on the 11-point system.

5. PRELIMINARY ROUNDS

- Each athlete will play all other athlete in his/her group once.
- Two points will be awarded for a win, one point for a loss and zero point for a withdrawal.
- The athlete ranking first and second place in each group will advance to 1/8 finals.
- The athlete ranking 3-4 place in each group will advance to consolation finals.
- In the case of athletes in same group have the same number of points, the final standings will be decided by the ITTF rules.

6. FINAL ROUNDS

- Finals will take place on one expanded court area, situated for best VIP, public, and media viewing as
 well as for optimal lighting for the players. An umpire and assistant umpire shall govern the match.
 Two additional scorekeeper umpires may occupy opposite diagonal corners so that spectators can
 more easily see the score.
- Allocation draws for 1/8 and quarter final will be held after preliminary round of all groups finished.
- The 1/8 finals will be between the group 1-2 place winners.
- The quarter finals will be between the 8 group winners.
- The semi-final will be between 4 quarter finals winners.
- The final will be between 2 semi-finals winners.
- Awards presentations shall take place immediately following the conclusion of the final.



7. DISCIPLINARY RULES

- The ICG Code of Conduct must be always adhered to. Athletes and coaches will be excluded from the Games for indecent behaviour, offence made through words and/or actions, violent behaviour, and abusive language.
- All delegations must comply with any instruction given by the venue staff.
- Coaches are responsible for the well-being and behaviour of their athletes at all times.



3. COMPETITION INFORMATION

- Number of coaches: One for every team.
- Number of athletes: minimum 2 players maximum two per gender. Maximum number of athletes: 32 per gender.
- Maximum number of teams: 16 per gender
- The tournament will begin with the singles main draw on Saturday 13th August 2022 and will end on Monday 15th August 2022 with the finals for doubles and the finals for singles main draw at the Tennis Venue.



- 4 indoor acrylic courts & 4 outdoor artificial clay courts. All 8 courts appropriate for singles and doubles matches.
- Two singles draw of 32 participants for boys and girls.
- Two doubles draw of 16 teams for boys and girls.
- Singles Events will be played using a compass draw format with first round winners continuing through
 the main draw and first round losers moving into a consolation compass draw. All singles entrants will
 be guaranteed a minimum of two matches in the event.
- For the needs of training, the athletes will be able to use the same courts or another one on Friday 12th August 2022.
- All equipment used by players must be appropriate for the match according the I.T.F. regulations.
- In case of rain all matches will be played inside.

4. COMPETITION RULES

- During a match only the players are allowed to be in the playing court. All the coaches must be outside the playing court and are not allowed to coach.
- Playing court size: -

Singles: 23.77m X 8.23m Doubles: 23.77m X 10.97m

- Warm up duration: 5 minutes.
- Matches will be played with official balls Wilson US Open.
- Each singles match will consist of best of three sets with the final set being a championship tie-break (tie-break to 10 points) (at 5-5 games in either of the first two sets a tie-break of 7 points will then be played)
- Each doubles match will consist of best of three sets two tie-break sets, with no ad scoring system (at 40-40 we play a deciding point, receiver's choice) and final set, championship tie-break (tie-break to 10 points).
- The first and second day of the tournament there is going to be a team of court supervisors supporting the Tournament Referee to oversee all match courts and resolve any issue between the players. It is responsibility of both players to keep the score of their match.
- All the players must be in the venue 50 minutes before the designated fixture in compliance with ITF rules and the clauses included in the ICG Sports Rules.



3. IDENTIFICATION

All athletes must show their accreditation cards with a photo; without this card an athlete cannot compete.

4. **COMPETITION RULES**

- Each city may register a maximum number of 8 girls and 8 boys and a minimum of 2 girls and 2 boys.
- Maximum 2 athletes from each team can participate in one event.
- Each athlete may compete in two events and TWO RELAY (4 x 100m, mix 4 x 100m).



- Girls running 800m and boys running 1500m are not allowed to compete in any other discipline the same day of their middle-distance competition (except for the relay).
- Athletics events: 100m, 400m, boys, 800m (girls only), 1500m (boys only), long jump, high jump, shot put, 4x100m relay, 4 x 100m –mix relay 2boys+2girls.
- Number of coaches: One for each boys' team, one for each girls' team.
- Personal best performance from each athlete will be required during registration for seeding purposes.
- Uniforms: Athletes must wear the uniform of their city.
- Competition numbers will be given to Team Managers/Coaches, who will be responsible for issuing bib numbers to all athletes in their team. The competition numbers must be worn firmly attached to the front and the back of the uniform with no less than four (4) pins so that the entire number and logo can be easily seen. No part of the number can be folded.
- Hip numbers will be provided by an official at the start of events requiring them.
- If an athlete fails to scratch from an event after confirmation, she/he may not be permitted to compete in any other event in the Games including relays (See World Athletics Rule TR4.4)
- The competition will take place according to World Athletics and ICG Rules.

5. CALL ROOM

- There will be a call room in operation.
- All athletes must report to the call room on time with their competition numbers attached to their uniform.
- In the call room athletes will be expected to demonstrate that their competition uniform, singlet and numbers, shoes and other equipment comply with the completion rules.
- Please do not take unnecessary items into the call room like mobile phones, ipods etc. as they will be confiscated.
- Athletes will proceed to the start of their event from the call room ACCOMPANIED BY A CALL ROOM
 JUDGE OR FIELD EVENT OFFICIAL. Athletes who proceed to the event not accompanied by a judge or
 official may not be allowed to start.
- The closing Call Entry Times at the call room are: (prior to scheduled event starting times)
 - Jumping and throwing events: 40 min.
 - o Running events: 30 min.
- The composition of a team and the order of running for a relay shall be officially declared 90 min prior to relay scheduled event starting times.



- This time allows for marshaling and movements to the competition site. The remainder of the time may
 be used to complete the warmup at the competition site where the competition site is not in use (under
 supervision of the officials).
- If an athlete is already, or is likely to be, competing in another event at the designated call time, the
 athlete or his/her team official must notify the Call Room of this circumstance prior to the designated
 call time.
- Athletes who will fail to be at the call room on time will be suspended!
- Warm up: Athletes may warm up in the designated area.
- Starting Blocks: must be used by all athletes in the 100m, 400m and relay. These will be supplied by the venue. No private blocks will be permitted.
- False start: Whether false start detection equipment is in use or not, any athlete deemed responsible for a false start shall be warned. An athlete deemed responsible for two false starts shall be disqualified.
 Rule T16(162) S1 UKA Rules for U15 competition.
- Shoes: The sole and heel of the shoe may be constructed so that they can accommodate up to 11 spikes. Any number of spikes between 0 and 11 may be used, but the number of spike positions cannot exceed 11. The protecting portion of the spike should not be longer than 9 mm. Exception is high Jump and javelin throwing, and javelin throwing where the length of more than 12 mm is not allowed. The spike point must be so designed, that at least half of the length measured from the tip of the spike, fits into a square mold with straight sides of 4 mm.

6. QUALIFICATION

100m

- Qualification: 8 heats, the first place of each heat and the 16 fastest runners for semi-final.
- 24 runners will advance to the semi-final. Advancement procedures will be set upon receipt of final entries.
- Semi-final: 3 heats, the first two places from each heat, and the two fastest runners will progress to the A final, and the second eight fastest runners will progress to the B final.
- MEDALS WILL BE GIVEN ONLY IN THE A FINAL.

400m

- Qualification: If the total number of participating is less than 32, then first place of each heat and the 4 fastest runners will progress to the A Final and the next 8 fastest runners will progress to the B Final.
- If the total number of teams participating is greater than 32, then 8 fastest runners will proceed to the A final and the next 8 fastest runners will progress to the B final.
- MEDALS WILL ONLY BE GIVEN IN THE A FINAL.



800m (girls only)

- Qualification: 6 heats, the first place of each heat and 2 fastest runners will progress to the final A, and the next eight fastest runners will progress to the final B
- Girls participating in the 800m run are not entitled to participate in another event on the same day.
- MEDALS WILL BE GIVEN ONLY IN THE A FINAL

1500m (boys only)

- Qualification: 5 heats, the first two places of each heat and 2 fastest runners will progress to the final A, and the next eight fastest runners will progress to the final B.
- Boys participating in the 1500m run are not entitled to participate in another event on the same day.
- MEDALS WILL BE GIVEN ONLY IN THE A FINAL.

Long Jump

- Qualification standard: Girls 5.00m, Boys 5.80m
- Qualification: each athlete has three attempts. All competitors who reach or exceed the
 qualification standard will progress to the final. If less than 12 athletes reach the qualification
 standard, the 12 best performances of qualification groups will progress to the final.
- Final: the best 8 athletes after three attempts will have three further attempts.

High Jump

- Qualification standard: Girls 1.55 m, Boys 1.65 m
- Qualification: All the competitors who will clear the above-mentioned qualifying standard reach
 the final. If less than 12 competitors jump the standard, the next best athletes in order will
 progress the final (until number of 12 competitors is reached).
- The heights for the qualifications:

The implements will be impounded until after the competition when athletes may collect them from the equipment room. Any competitor may use all implements in the pool.

4 x 100m Mix Relay (2 boys + 2 girls - free placement of participants in stages).
